The following book is a supplemental work to the 1898 Carpenter Memorial.

This independent work adds the family of Cephas Warner Carpenter. It also adds some information that is not in the 1898 Carpenter Memorial on the Carpenter ancestry.

Cephas Warner Carpenter is Number in the Carpenter Memorial on page 506. He is RIN 12465. A family is listed as Family 193. Moses Carpenter is Number 4836 in the Carpenter Memorial on page 506. No family is listed in that 1898 book.

On page 31 of the following book (digital page 23 of 24), the following is cited in part.

COLONEL CEPHAS WARNER CARPENTER, son of Ira and Esther Ann (Luce) Carpenter, was born in Moretown, Vermont, August 2, 1832, and died at Deadwood, South Dakota, August 10, 1902. He was a pioneer in the Northwest, coming to St. Paul in 1855, as a bookkeeper for the J. C. Burbank Company. He operated stages between St. Paul and La Crosse, which were afterwards taken over by Blakely and Carpenter, in different parts of Minnesota.
